# Conditions of Entry

The following conditions of entry will apply to all Redfern Oval customers. These conditions should be read in conjunction with the ticket conditions appearing on www.rabbitohs.com.au and in the letter accompanying your tickets.

### Refusal of Entry

For the comfort, safety and enjoyment of all patrons, SSFC Management reserves the right to:

- Refuse entry to any persons deemed to be intoxicated and / or disorderly;
- Refuse entry to any unauthorised persons
- Refuse entry of items which have the potential to cause injury or public nuisance

### **General Conditions**

- Patrons should be aware that footballs may be kicked from the playing field into the seating areas during the event.
  Patrons are advised this can occur at any time.
- Patrons only showing a Grandstand ticket will be permitted entry to the Grandstand.
- There is one reserved seating area only. This has been allocated for SSFC Corporate Partners, Legends and VIPs and patrons must be ticketed accordingly
- As a minimum, patrons must be appropriately clothed for a public place with footwear compulsory
- SSFC Management reserves the right to inspect/ search bags brought into or out of Redfern Oval
- Persons gaining unauthorised access to Redfern Oval and / or the venue's arena may be liable for prosecution
- Patrons who cause a disturbance or refuse to comply with the requests made by SSFC staff, security or customer service employees will be evicted from the premises.
- Pass-outs will not be issued
- Alcoholic beverages cannot be taken into or from Redfern Oval by patrons
- Smoking on the premises is only permitted in designated smoking areas and not within seating or enclosed areas
- Customers wishing to bring personal items into Redfern Oval do so at their own risk. SSFC Management will not be held liable for any personal property.
- Umbrellas may be brought into the ground but for the comfort of others should not be put up while seated.
- Due to safety reason, strollers and prams are not permitted in the Oval's grandstand
- Unauthorised soliciting and customer surveying is not permitted
- Customers are not permitted to throw any objects around or within the Redfern Oval seating areas
- No patrons are to enter the field of play at any time
- All patrons must exit the ground by 8:30pm
- Professional photographic and video equipment is not permitted in Redfern Oval

## **Ticketing Conditions**

- RTR tickets may not be resold or offered for resale at a premium (including on-line auction sites). If a ticket sold or used in breach of this condition, the ticket may be cancelled without a refund and the bearer of the ticket will be refused admission.
- No refund or exchange on any ticket except as required by law as otherwise specified by the seller.
- Lost tickets will not be replaced.
- Entry may be refused if tickets are damaged or defaced in any way or are not purchased from the Rabbitohs.
- Scalping warning In addition, the resale of tickets in certain circumstances is governed by ticket sales legislations and may attract criminal penalties.

### Restricted / Prohibited Items

The following restricted / prohibited items are not permitted at Redfern Oval:

- Glass or cans
- Flares / Fireworks
- Metal flag poles, extendable flag poles and / or flag poles of more than 1.4m in length
- Whistles, hooters and horns
- Confetti or shredded paper
- Not to wear or otherwise display commercial, political or other offensive signage or logos
- Flags over 1m x 1M

- Alcoholic beverages
- Laser pointers
- Knives and other dangerous weapons
- Oversized banners and flags which are deemed to cause public nuisance
- Scooters, roller skates, skateboards and push bikes
- Other items determined by SSFC Management that may cause injury or public nuisance
- Large eskies

#### Liquor Licensing

All persons entering Redfern Oval are advised that:

- They are entering licensed premises;
- Intoxicated persons will not be permitted to enter nor will persons in possession of liquor;
- Checking procedures will apply to prevent persons possessing liquor from entering;
- Intoxicated persons will be removed from the premises;
- It is an offence for minors to purchase and consume liquor;
- It is an offence to purchase liquor for (or supply liquor to) minors;
- Persons supplying liquor to minors will be reported to the Police. Penalties apply under the Liquor Act 2007.
